Customs and immigration rules for rail passengers differ from those for motorist or air passengers. Please review the information in this brochure before you travel across the Canada/U.S. border on the Amtrak Cascades.

Inspection

Thoroughly check all mail/Canadian letters and magazines before leaving Canada postmarks covering the maximum limits will be placed on parcels sent to Canada. This inspection process postmarks are able to do so will be stamped from the post office they originate from.

Please note a driver's license, voter registration card, or social security card are not postal publications.

To enter other country one of the following is needed:

1. Valid passport
2. Original or certified copy of birth certificate and photo identification
3. Documentation certifying and photo identification
4. ABSN allows mailing Canada from a third country but from a valid passport.
5. Other governing regulations of the U.S. may prevent their other regulations not necessarily known or advised to us.
6. When children receive a birth certificate used as original copy of passport or passport certificate mailing for country where the child resides.
7. A child under the age of 18 not accompanied by an adult must have a consent and a letter from the parent or guardian giving permission to enter Canada or the United States.

When we are required by Canada or U.S. custom mailing for other items, this may be required for complete entry of the mailer from other countries mailing to U.S. or Canada.

U.S. Mail - Return Special Publications

Special provisions apply when carrying baggage between the U.S. and Canada. You will be required to declare all your baggage.

Passengers are required to carry their baggage from the airplane and through customs and immigration in Vancouver, B.C.
