RAILROADING READING

Railroading holds a special place in the hearts and minds of many Americans. Herewith, we submit capsule comments on six books about railroading and its history that will surely please any true rail buff.

Railroad Trains and Train People in American Culture (Random House), edited by James Alan MacPherson and Miller Williams is a fine introduction to railroading lore. It is a collection of nearly everything connected with the subject—history, songs, essays dating back to the 1850's, hundreds of photographs and paintings, timetables and menus.

Railroads of America (American Heritage), by Oliver Jensen, is a history of railroading with an opinion. In the book, an appealing history full of color photographs, Mr. Jensen expresses the view that the time to save the railroads is now, before the current history of railroading becomes ancient history.

If you're into collecting railroad memorabilia, George Klamkin's **Railroadiana** is a must. This new book presents and discusses: antique railroad timetables, brakemen's kerosene lamps, keys, buttons, dining car silver, handbills, posters, and hundreds of other items.

More Classic Trains (Kalmbach Publishing) is a new, 512-page book of pictures and text by the dean of passenger train historians, Arthur B. Dubin. In words and 1,500 pictures, Mr. Dubin describes almost every continental railroad: its history, service, the evolution of its locomo-

tives and rolling stock, its dining car menus, and other items of interest to the student of railroading. Mr. Dubin presents life aboard the steam locomotive cars during prohibition, depression, and war.

Railroads: The Great American Adventure (National Geographic) is a chronological history of America's railroads and their impact on the growth of the United States and its economy. Author Charlton Ogburn relates the story of the railroads from the time of the "Teakettle on Wheels" in 1839 to the present day and the future. The 200 pages are filled with color photographs of black and white prints from yesteryear, and a number of illustrations depicting trains, towns, and various historical events related to railroading.

Robert Baxter's **Usarail Pass Guide**, published by Rail-Europe in association with Amtrak, is a 300-page book packed with useful information for today's rail passenger.

Baxter begins by describing every city on Amtrak's rail network from coast to coast, including: detailed maps of the area, points of interest, fares, fees for services and admissions (to parks and museums), and histories of each place. There are chapters on where to change money, telephone numbers, train whistles, and inexpensive hotels.

Rail passengers will find Baxter's guide an indispensable tool either in planning their travels, or during their travels.

TRAIN OF THE FUTURE HERE TODAY

Amtrak has an entire fleet of futuristic Turboliners now serving New York State from New York City to Buffalo, in addition to the route of the Adirondack from Montreal to New York City.

The Turboliner is built to a sophisticated French design, with some of the most innovative developments ever in train construction. An advanced suspension system provides a smooth, cushioned ride. Carpeting on floors, walls, and ceilings and thick insulation subdue interior sounds and act to prevent exterior noise from interrupting conversation and concentration. An

Each 5-car Turboliner has engines fore and aft to eliminate delays caused by engine changes. Doors at boarding entrances and between cars open electronically. Turboliners have three distinct sections: Turbocoach, Turbocafe and Turboclub. Each section has been designed to accommodate passenger comfort and convenience.

Turbocoach. The spacious Turbocoach car offers wide picture windows and reclining seats that are actually wider than normal first-class airline seats. The pull-down table in front of the seat is useful for enjoying a meal, writing a letter or working. An overhead switch provides a beam of light for reading. The padded rack above the seat has plenty of room for luggage. Restrooms with clean stainless steel appointments are situated either fore or aft in each coach car.

Turbocafe. The Turboliner has its own compact cafe section that offers everything from soft drinks to cocktails, a quick snack to a complete dinner. The facilities sparkle, the service is fast and the prices are surprisingly low.

Coach passengers order over the counter, and enjoy their food and drinks at their seats.



BETTER IN BUNCHES
