

Welcome to Norfolk's Bicentennial Celebration

Swelling Norfolk, an official American Bicentennial City, cordially invites you to help celebrate our nation's 200th birthday.

Norfolk is rich in American history. Founded in 1800, it served as an important seaport and meeting ground for our Virginia pioneers, many of whom followed the War of Independence. . . .

Today Norfolk offers many Bicentennial special events and attractions, including elegant 17th- & 18th-century homes open to the public, the only British colonial mace presented to an American city, and Old St. Paul's Church built in 1719. Still embedded in St. Paul's outer wall is a British cannonball fired during the burning of Norfolk by Lord Dunmore in 1776.

There's plenty to see and do in modern Norfolk too.

A wide range of quality hotel accommodations at reasonable rates is offered in our Downtown, Seaboard, and Ocean View Beach areas. Car rental rates are also listed in this Norfolk Bicentennial folder.

HERMITAGE FOUNDATION MUSEUM —

Built in 1908, this English Tudor style mansion houses 13 galleries of art treasures from all four corners of the world in 12 acres overlooking the tranquil Lafayette River.

THE MOSES MYERS HOUSE —

One of the most elegant townhouses in the South. Built in 1792, Gen. Lafayette Prevost, James Murray, and Daniel Webster lived here. Period pieces display the style of Oppenheimer, Hepplewhite, and Thomas Sheraton.

THE U.S. NAVAL BASE —

Four America's largest warships at the largest naval base in the world established in 1767. Of interest are nuclear powered aircraft carriers, submarines, and destroyers.

GENERAL DONALD MAZARATHI MEMORIAL

Here is where the famous General is entombed and the site of a massive collection tracing his colonial career. The structure is Norfolk's old City Hall built in 1847. Its nine galleries house exhibits ranging from Mazarathi's famous pipe collection to his weapons and related military cap.

OLD ST. PAUL'S CHURCH —

The lone survivor of the British bombardment and destruction of Norfolk on the eve of the American Revolution. Built in 1738, its giant oak trees shade the graves of four centuries. A cannonball fired by the British during the bombardments still embedded in an outer wall of the old church.



ADAM THOROUGHGOOD HOUSE —

The oldest standing brick house built by the English in America dates back to 1636. Located on the banks of the beautiful Lynnhaven River, the rugged simplicity of the house reflects our English heritage tempered with the characteristics of a home on America's early frontier.

GARDENS BY THE SEA —

Some 175 acres of lush landscape and spectacular flora await the camera bug. Tour by boat, treadmill, train or trolley car. Site of the annual International Azalea Festival in April, plantings are so timed that seasonal flowers greet the visitor all year-round.

THE WILLOUGHBY-BAYLOR HOUSE —

Built in 1784, this residence is furnished with authentic 18th century pieces which give a remarkable insight into the life of a post-revolutionary family. Its exterior design reflects both Georgian and Federal architecture.



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THE CHRYSLER MUSEUM —

Open an museum in the Southeast, it houses 140 million worth of treasures from the collection of automobile fan Walter Chrysler, Jr., who lives in Norfolk. A new American Wing will help commemorate Norfolk's Bicentennial celebrations.

LAFAYETTE ZOOLOGICAL PARK —

On the Lafayette River, Norfolk's 85-acre zoo houses 350 animals ranging from backyard animals to rare white rhinos. Adjacent aquatic facilities and a large playground.

HARBOR CRUISE —

The most enjoyable way to see the many historic water-front landmarks of the world's largest natural harbor and the site of the famous clash between the Monitor and the Merrimack. Enjoy the panoramic view and cruise past large freighters on their way to markets around the world. Or your choice of drinks and entertainment at the high spots of footcork regatta.

Colonial Williamsburg

Two hundred years ago Williamsburg was a place of elegant mansions, graceful buildings—richly furnished, and green gardens on the edge of the wilderness. It was the capital city of a colony that encompassed the territory of eight of our present states. Here, too, the seeds of revolution and freedom were planted.

Today, those same buildings and gardens have been restored to their former beauty. The triumph that other city lives again—in the taverns, on the streets, in the mile-long colonial city that has been faithfully and meticulously restored by the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation.

Repeal from Norfolk by motorcoach, or scheduled carrier, traveling through Hampton and Newport News and the lovely Tidewater countryside on your trip to Williamsburg. Upon arrival, you'll view an orientation film and then explore the fascinating colonial town. Costumed guides explain the history and significance of each building.

You'll see the Capitol, the jail with its gory and stocks, and Williamsburg's "mile of history" Duke of Gloucester Street. A full day of Bicentennial History, and tours with motorcoach, or scheduled carrier, to Norfolk for a delightful evening on your own.

Norfolk Today:



Buffy Norfolk, on the Virginia Coast, is located in one of the most favored climates regions in the country. With long summers and delightful spring and fall temperatures, Norfolk's weather is well suited for most outdoor activities at any season. Golf is a favorite sport in the area . . . and there's there's boating, sailing, surfing, water skiing and plain sunbathing. For the fishermen there's deep-sea fishing, pier fishing and surf casting from Norfolk's own beach (only 15 minutes from downtown). Ocean View Beach offers 14 miles of sandy, tranquil beaches on the Chesapeake Bay.



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Downtown Norfolk has been transformed dramatically. Hundreds of acres are the location for modern, high-rise buildings connected by path-like promenades and malls with ample parking space in adjacent covered garages. While establishing itself as the commercial financial center of eastern Virginia, Norfolk has not forsaken its cultural-recreational responsibility. Year-long programs offer concerts, ballet, Broadway shows and professional sporting events.



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Boops, Norfolk's Convention and Cultural Center, is a multi-purpose facility constructed for beauty professionals on the mid-Atlantic. The complex dominates a 17-acre plaza in the center of the downtown area. Many excellent hotels and restaurants are within walking distance. For dining, we return to the sea and harvest our local waters. Dinner could turn into an evening of entertainment but it doesn't have to. Sample our night life, there's something for every taste. Intimate lounges, musical reviews, theaters, even amusement parks for you and your anticipation. Norfolk . . . it's a shore thing.
