ATLANTA

See Atlanta and all that it has to offer. This is a city steeped in the romance and tradition of the Old South, yet it is a city a step ahead of the times.

As a visitor to this fascinating city, you'll want to see the famed "Underground Atlanta" with its unique dining and entertainment center beneath the city's streets.

Stone Mountain, rising 685 feet from the plain, is the world's largest mass of exposed granite. As a monument to the Confederacy, the mountain's face has a huge carving of Generals Robert E. Lee, Stonewall Jackson and Confederate President Jefferson Davis. This unusual mountain is surrounded by a 3200 acre park which includes Magnolia Hall, an authentic antebellum plantation.

Just beyond Atlanta city limits, is Six Flags Over Georgia which represents Georgia's history under the flags of England, France, Spain, the Confederacy, Georgia and the U.S., with a separate section of the park devoted to each flag.

There's no end to the things to see and do in Atlanta.
